What inspired me into digital and tech... In my high-school days, I was intrigued by the tech industry dynamic as it offered a great prospect for continuous learning throughout life. Working in tech provides a unique opportunity to actively participate in shaping our future since technology plays a vital role in numerous fields, from communication to healthcare, etc.

My educational background is... After studying for a Master's in Electronic Multimedia Editions, I completed GlobalLogic Manual Basecamp in Ukraine, successfully passed the final test and interviews, and started to work there as Associate Manual QA on a media project. 10 months later I joined GlobalLogic UK&I and am now planning to explore the Automation side of testing in order to better fill positions on existing and upcoming GL projects.

What advice I'd give to girls thinking about a career in digital and tech... There are many online resources available that can help you get started. Search and attend local industry events and conferences to meet people who work in the digital and tech fields. Networking can help you make connections and learn about job opportunities. Look for mentors who are working in the digital and tech fields and ask them for guidance and advice. This can be a great way to gain insight into the industry and learn about potential career paths.
